# **Brand Hierarchy B**

Currently Great Stuff has several sub designations: Pro, Pro Only, Pro Suggested, Heavy Duty (Tools), and Premium (Caulk). We recommend having a clear delineation across the entire brand—resulting in a stronger, more unified brand voice.

#### Site Architecture ---

The site architecture needs to be restructured to include category pages so users can drill down to a final selection.

#### Information Architecture 🥍



The on-page content should be reorganized to highlight the information that's most relevant to the user in a clear and concise way.

#### **Omni-Channel**

Currently there is no omni-channel experience within the Great Stuff brand. Based on our in-store market research of Great Stuff and competing brands, no one is utilizing web URLs nor QR codes to engage customers. This presents an opportunity to become a frontrunner within the market by offering this experience.







#### Gorilla Glue Mega Menu



- Page names are clear & concise
- Option to use navigation ribbon on Homepage
- Categorization helps users quickly narrow down to the type of product they need
- Navigation provides too many ways for user to get to product pages
- Readability is not great, some spacing issues












### **Gorilla Glue Category Page**





- The category page allows the user to quicky drill down to a specific product

Overall function of the page works well






### Gorilla Glue Product Comparison Guide

Feature idea: Allow users to select products as they browse, then bring them to an interactive comparison chart









### Gorilla Glue Product Detail Page

Overall layout, photography, help guide, and product recommendations would be great additions to the Great Stuff site










# LOCTITE Mega Menu



- Page names are clear & concise
- Ability to navigate by product or by project
- Prominent links to Product Advisor
- Not ideal UX to have scroll within navigation

Mega menus show all the information at once and are easier to navigate (ie, through grouping) than regular dropdown menus






# **LOCTITE Category Page**





- Concise product descriptions
- While this page is clear and straightforward, more emphasis should be put on the category of products
- Space could be used more efficiently
- General layout is a bit heavy handed
- Easy links to find and/or purchase a product, but elevated too high on page









### **LOCTITE Product Detail Page**



- Clean and straightforward layout
- Good use of bulleted list of features and benefits
- Nice incorporation of how-to videos
- Space could be used more efficiently
- Bulleted list could be more concise

Using a quick bulleted list at the top of the page rather than a long product description would be a concise way to communicate










#### LOCTITE Find Your Product



- **...** Comprehensive project → product mapping tool
- Allows user to track & revise selections
- End page shares suggested product detail page & has CTA to buy
- Would be nice to incorporate real imagery vs. just iconography
- End page could include "not what you're looking for?" with some related products

"Know me to serve me" feature can also have cookies to track users which can help better serve returning customers in the future








#### DAP Mega Menu





- Navigation is easily scannable
- Way too many brands, without context for the new consumer
- Some project categories are too vague & could have overlap with others (ie, Household Repair)








# **DAP Category Page**

Win by: Telling a strong brand narrative with authentic product photography to demonstrate real world usage






### **DAP Product Detail Page**

Feature Idea: Integrate a visual tagging system of where/how products can be used









#### DAP Pro vs. DIY

- Photography is tired












- **Easily navigable & legible**

- Repetition in same name for multiple pages can cause confusion



















# Gap Inc. Category Page

Utility navigation is a great way to show the connection with other brands








# Gap Inc. Product Detail Page

- Sidebar is a bit busy











#### Navigation

- Great opportunity to rethink information hierarchy to elevate what is most important to consumer










